Student of the Week

Every student will get the chance to be the Student of the Week. I'll send out the schedule of due dates and post it on my web page along with a sample project. The idea of this project is for each student to tell their story. In the end, it will look a little like a book with tidbits of information on the outside telling us a little bit about the author, your child.

Here are the directions:

Decorate a cereal box (or any dry goods box - I used a regular size Cheezit box. It can't be any bigger than a Family Size box of cereal.)

<u>Tip:</u> A box that's a little bigger, allows more creative room, which is something I ran out of. I will leave that choice up to parent and child.

Everyone has two copies of the Student of the Week cut-outs. I gave two copies just in case a mistake is made. The shapes on this page are a <u>must have</u> on the box. The lines/spaces are a little small so the second grade author can dictate to a writing helper if needed. Once they are all filled out, cut them out, and get ready to glue!

Next, the children should have some fun with the box! They can cover it, color it, put stickers on it, glue things on it, draw pictures, add photos, and do anything else they can think of that is creative and will tell all about them! Be sure to include the Student of the Week cut outs on the box. Helping hands are ok with me in difficult spots, as long as the creative genius is a brilliant second grader AND they are working on it, too.
